



Dear Readers



- Kriti Gupta of XII-A secured the second position in e-poster making competition.



- A webinar on 'Home Schooling- the New Normal' was organised for the parents of classes X - XII from 21- 23 August 2020. The guest speaker was Ms Nitika Dutta Gupta, a teacher and freelance writer closely associated with Scholastic publications. Ms. Gupta focused on the difficulties faced by students in understanding concepts and concentrating during online classes. She advised the parents to be a strong emotional support to their children and suggested several ways to build a healthy relationship with them in these difficult times.
- A webinar was also organized for classes VI- IX from 13 16
 September 2020 on 'Positive Pandemic Parenting'. The resource
 person for this webinar was Mr. Vivek Kumar. Mr. Kumar focused on
 the importance of parent child bonding. He asked the parents to
 keep a track of the online activities of their children as unknowingly
 digital footprints are created which become difficult to erase.
- November 2020 for the students of class X and XII and their parents. It was organised to enhance the academic performance of the students. Our Principal, Rev. Sr. Merlin C J addressed the parents and the students. She highlighted the importance of hard work and perseverance. calling out to Mother Mary through


rosary.




congregation stands.


A comprehensive schedule with different timings and small groups was prepared to help the students



From our side, we provided meaningful activities to keep everyone engaged but soon understood that not everyone is in the same condition to do those. Everyone's parents were working from home and those who had siblings were vying for separate laptops and needed extra data on a daily basis. So, to ease their difficulties, we gave different class

timings to senior and junior students. Teachers went one step further for those who were in dire need and provided them with digital aid so that they can learn in peace.

But time and distance were also playing their part well in the crisis. "What would normally take us one period to teach in the classroom took twice as long." Thankfully, CBSE understood it timely and decreased the syllabus for class X and XII students. Humans are social animals. Working from home, or worse, from quarantine, is isolating and often depressing for both teachers and students.

We made a concentrated effort to speak to our students to provide emotional and psychological context to our work. School gave opportunity to students to participate in online competitions. They were given various chances to showcase their talent through different activities. We told the students as well as ourselves:

Though we sailed through the storm, we are still waiting for the shore. Our students are now appearing for board exams. Hopefully, they will shine and make us proud! 




